"Los Posadas Navidenas" begins Wednesday evening, December 16 at 6:45 PM in Sts Peter & Paul Church. This is a traditional Mexican custom of finding lodging (Posadas or "inn") for Joseph and Mary for the birth of the Christ-Child. It starts with a gathering in the Church of all CCD students, all interested parishioners and SPPS students who want to participate. Everyone is welcome! Bring your own candle and feel free to come with a shepherd costume or any nativity character. Come and enjoy the Nativity spirit!

"Posadas" in Church will begin with a song, the lighting of the candles, and a procession to the first inn (house) while saying the rosary. There will be singing, praying, and snacks at the first house where they will receive the Posada. Please feel free to bring snacks or candy to each house. Each night following we will begin at the previous house and journey to another house to receive the Posada.

What Then Should We Do

Luke 3:7-18

Expectation was high for the Messiah's coming; in fact, many asked John the Baptist whether he was the Messiah. But as he explained to the crowds who gathered, his water was no match for the fire of the Holy Spirit to come.

John issued a warning, however: "every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire" (v. 9). This prompted the worried listeners to ask, "What then should we do?"

While John's directions were specific, the meaning is relevant today: share with anyone who has none; take only your fair share; be satisfied and just and honest. We are to prepare for the Lord by creating "good fruit" from all that he's given us.

- Do I represent Jesus' teachings in my interactions with my children, family, friends, and neighbors?
- Do I live with the integrity of a follower of Christ?
- Am I preparing my heart for the birth of Jesus?

In your Advent prayer, ask yourself, "What then should I do?" When you act with the intention of preparing for the Messiah, the possibilities for the fruit that you might bear are endless. With God, nothing is impossible!

Gaudete Sunday

FAMILY FOCUS

Recycle Christmas Cards

SYMBOLS of the Season

Advent is rich with sacred symbols. The Scriptures are filled with images of light and darkness, cacophony and silence, waiting and fulfillment. The season's color is deep purple, reflecting the penitential and preparatory nature of the season. Watch for these symbols:

- **Candlelight** – Christ is the light of the world
- **Evergreen** – In Jesus, we are given the gift of eternal life
- **Water** – We recall our baptism and are born anew in Jesus
- **Chant** – We await the birth of the babe in the manger
- **Angels** – Witnesses to the Good News
- **Star** – The cosmic sign that the King of Kings has been born

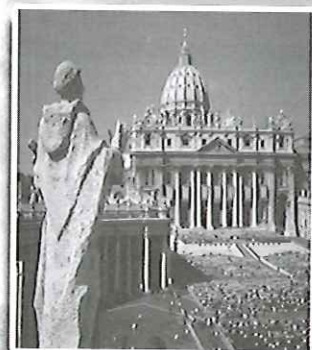
