We continue to extend our Lenten message to others: The parable of the Prodigal Son in Luke 15: 11-32 is a perfect example of Mercy. "This is our heavenly Father", says Pope Francis. "The God that waits for us. Always."

The Gospel of

Lenten Reflection for the Year of Mercy

The Call to Transformation

Luke 9:28b-36

The three synoptic Gospels each tell L the story of Jesus' transfiguration. This miracle is unique among the others in the Gospels in that the miracle happens to Jesus himself. Luke tells us that Jesus goes up the mountain to pray, and it is during prayer that he is transfigured.

The Transfiguration is one of the five major milestones in the Gospel narrative of the life of Jesus, the others being Baptism, Crucifixion,

Resurrection, and

Ascension. In 2002, Pope Saint John Paul II introduced the Luminous Mysteries of the Rosary, which includes the Transfiguration.

This Gospel story is also about the disciples and ourselves. This passage, as well as the first reading, describes encounters with God. These encounters happen to people who are confused, afraid, and in the dark. Yet experiencing God's presence with us can change us. Prayer readies us and calls us to change. There is an old saying, "If you don't want to change, then don't pray."



"We all need to go apart, to ascend the mountain in a space of silence, to find ourselves and better perceive the voice of the Lord. This we do in prayer. But we cannot stay there! Encounter with God in prayer inspires us anew to 'descend the mountain' and return to the plain where we meet many brothers weighed down by fatigue, sickness, injustice, ignorance, poverty, both material and spiritual."



- > Lent is our mountaintop that we go to in prayer to be transformed. What needs to be transformed in me this Lent? What in my life needs to be touched by the brightness of transfiguration?
- Do I miss God in my life because I'm too busy, I doubt, I'm afraid, or I don't understand God's simplicity and closeness?
- When has one of my mountaintop experiences given me the strength to continue to be a person of mercy and compassion?



The Cloud

The cloud that overshadows the mountain of the Transfiguration is an important image of God's presence; it is also found in today's first reading and throughout the Old Testament. As you watch the clouds and their many forms this week, think about the myriad ways God is always with you.



- **>** Do you know someone who is experiencing pain right now? What could you do this week to give that person a transfiguring, hopeful experience?
- As a follower of Jesus, is there some topic that you need to learn more about? Might it be care for creation, immigration, the reality of today's homeless, etc.?
- ➤ The apostles probably retained a picture in their mind of this transfiguring event for the rest of their lives. Select a few photos from experiences in your life. Relive the memories; recall God's blessings that came to you during those events and gatherings.



Faithful Family

Use a tree branch that you have potted or placed on a table (perhaps in your desert space). Each day as you gather for family prayer, invite members to tell of a time they felt God's presence that day and, as they are talking, tie a yellow ribbon (or yarn) to one of the branches. If there is time, you might share something each person did to change/transform their world and tie a purple ribbon to the tree. Watch the tree continue to blossom.
