The Parish theme for Lent 2015 is LET US PRAY -OREMUS. In order for us to be more devoted in our prayer life, Fr. Arul is guiding sessions on Prayer called "OREMUS", authored by Fr. Mark Topus every Friday evening. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy will be at 6:00 PM followed by OREMUS at 6:30-7:30 PM in the church. You may join us even if you had not previously signed up.

FREE BABYSITTING: Cindy Hemman and family have graciously volunteered to babysit for the Friday evening Oremus sessions during Lent so young couples can attend. Call her at 336-3630 if you would like to bring your children with you to Church.

Additional Lenten Devotions include Stations of the Cross to be held every Friday at 2:00 PM. Starting this weekend, Feb 21st & 22nd, there will be a Lenten Bulletin Insert each weekend which features a Family Activity, along with other Lenten insights and Prayers. Be sure to do this week's Family Activity and continue this all during Lent. Use small pieces of paper to list your Prayer Person, then place in a bowl. We will gather them at the end of Lent and Fr. Arul will pray for them, then burn them in the Holy Saturday Evening fire. Get the whole family involved!

Adult Choir Practice will be every Tuesday at 7 PM from now until Easter, unless otherwise notified.

The First Sunday of Lent

Lenten Regulations: All Catholics are obliged to abstain from meat on all Fridays of Lent, if health allows. Fasting (1 larger meal, 2 smaller meals, no eating between meals) is required only on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The Church also asks that all Catholics do some sort of Lenten fasting. Fasting is the limiting of food intake by eating less, or eating plainer, less tasty foods, all for the building of God's Kingdom - beginning with you - in unity with all the Catholics of the world, and especially Jesus.

"Even the Pope goes to Confession" -Pope Francis. Join Pope Francis and millions of Catholics around the world this Lent and "make your appointment with Jesus". Kansas Catholic Churches are open for Confession every Wednesday of Lent from 6-7 PM (also 2:30-3:30 PM every Saturday at SPPC).

RCIA - As we begin the Lenten season please keep our RCIA Catechymens in prayer: Chelsey McGhee, Rebecca Karnowski, Jessica Weaver and Tammy Haverkamp, who will be confirming her faith in the Sacrament of Confirmation. On March 1st they will celebrate the Rite of Election where they come before Archbishop Naumann and sign their intent of joining the Church. They will be coming into full communion with the Church receiving the sacraments during Holy Saturday Evening Mass.



Jesus in the Desert

Mark 1:12-15

Before Jesus began his ministry, the Spirit drove him out into the desert. After 40 days he emerged to announce that the kingdom of God was at hand and to encourage the people to "repent, and believe in the gospel." As we begin the season of Lent, we, too, enter into our own desert as part of our renewal of heart.



Today's Gospel contains two key events of the beginning of Jesus's ministry. First, he went out into the desert for 40 days, where he was tempted by Satan and ministered to by angels. Next, after the death of John the Baptist, Jesus announced that the "time of fulfilment" was at hand, and he began his preaching and teaching. What lesson lies here for us? While Lent is a time of service to others, it must also be a time of preparation and renewal of self. We cannot give what we do not have. Just as Jesus had to spend time in the desert, so we, too, need to take time to allow God to show us where we need to change and give us the conviction to act on those changes.

 What will I do this Lent as an outward sign of my repentance?

 What would I like to accomplish spiritually over the next six weeks?

 What is one thing I will do daily during this Lenten season?

As Lent is the time for greater love, listen to Jesus' thirst.... 'Repent and believe,' Jesus tells us. What are we to repent? Our indifference, our hardness of heart. What are we to believe? Jesus thirsts even now, in your heart and in the poor — he knows your weakness. He wants only your love, wants only the chance to love you.

CATHOLIC INSIGHTS 40 days in the desert

Why did Jesus spend 40 days in the desert before beginning his ministry? The number 40 has a special meaning in Scripture and is symbolic of preparation before a major life change. Moses spent 40 days fasting and praying on Mount Zion when he received the Ten Commandments (Exodus 34:28). An Israelite patrol spent 40 days spying on the land of Canaan before reporting back to Moses and Aaron

(Numbers 13:25). And the entire Israelite people spent 40 years wandering in the desert before gaining access to the Promised Land (Numbers 14:34). Jesus likewise spent 40 days before leaving his old life as the son of the carpenter to bring new life to the entire world.

Melissa The days of Lent have traditionally been used as a spiritual pilgrimage, in which we symbolically travel with Jesus to his death on the cross. To help emphasize the idea of Lent as a journey, collect 40 small stones, one for each day of the season. (These are sometimes available at craft stores.) Each night at dinner, pray for one person and write his or her name with a marker on one of the pebbles. Collect the stones in a small bowl, and during Holy Week use them to make a "mound" of prayer that holds up a crucifix.

SIGNS OF THE SEASON

By Any Other Name

The word "Lent" has a specific religious connotation today, but originally it was used to mean "spring." It derived from the Germanic root word for "long," because in spring the days begin to get longer. In Latin-based languages, the word for the season derives from the term quadragesima, meaning "fortieth," indicating the fortieth day before Easter. In other parts of the world, the name means "a time of fasting."


