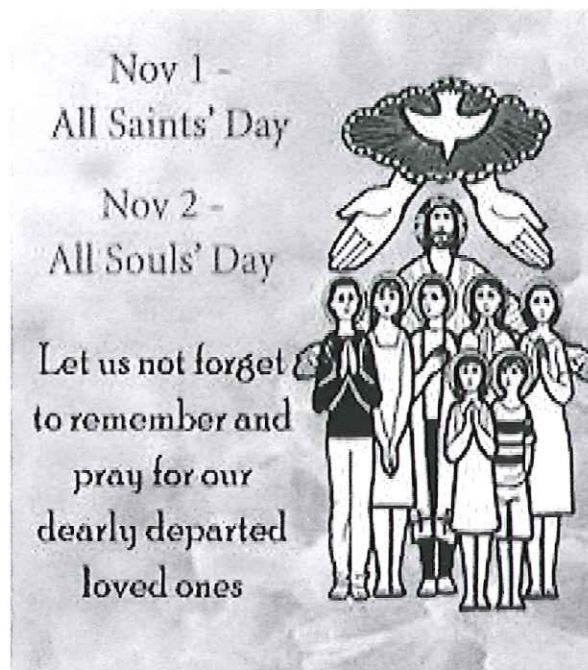

ORPHAN SUNDAY – November 2

Foster care is a Church problem, not a state child welfare problem. It is a Gospel issue first, not a government issue. The Church has both the duty and privilege to speak on behalf of and stand for the sake of those who cannot speak and stand for themselves because that is exactly what God has done for us through Jesus. That's the Gospel. Here are some ways to support the 500,000 orphans in America:

1. Become a Foster Parent. The foster system is in desperate need of more licensed homes.
2. Become a respite provider. Help support foster parents by keeping a child on a short-term basis....24-48 hours.
3. Set aside time to pray each and every day. Start a bible study. (e.g. ALL IN Orphan Care: Small Group Curriculum)
4. Support Foster Parents by providing a meal, offering to babysit or provide short relief time to a foster child, or help with providing hand-me down clothing.
5. Get involved with SHOW HOPE (Steven Curtis Chapman) and help provide financial aid for families wishing to adopt.
6. Provide photography session to foster children. Many come without any photos or memorabilia.
7. Duffel Bag Project...gather a group of friends and make 6 or more duffel bags! Provide foster agencies such as KVC or St. Francis with duffel bags to hand to foster kids who have nothing to take to their new placements (www.handsonnetwork.org)
8. Help stock a supply pantry: in conjunction with the care packages provide items like diapers, toothbrushes, underwear, twin bedding, cribs, strollers, car seats, baby equipment, bikes, gift cards and other things that families may immediately need upon a child placement.

James 1:27 "Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world."

Psalm 68:5 "Father of the fatherless and protector of widows, is God in his holy habitation."

Psalm 10:14 "But you, God, see the trouble of the afflicted; you consider their grief and take it in hand. The victims commit themselves to you; you are the helper of the fatherless."

Related Fact: The average number of referrals coming through the system in our area totals 80 children per month who need a home, temporary homes, care, food, and clothing.

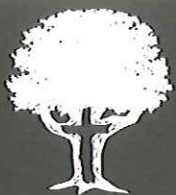
