Our leader, Carl Anderson, summed it up by saying, "This sense of fraternity is at the foundation of our call." "Our charitable activity is all the more effective because it is supported by our fraternal brotherhood." The activities that we Knights of Columbus members take part in are enjoyable. We enjoy helping other people. We take pride in all of our charitable endeavors, and we have fun in what we do. So, how are the Knights of Columbus Charitable? For the 14th consecutive year, the Knights set a new record in charitable giving, with over \$170 million and 70.5 million hours of voluntary service given during 2013 alone. These Knights donated over 421,000 hours in their communities in 2013. And, in the last decade, the Knights of Columbus have donated nearly \$1.5 BILLION to charity and 683 million hours to charitable endeavors.

In 2013, Carl Anderson also explained "Knights were part of relief efforts for a number of tragic events, including two enormous natural disasters in the Philippines; tornadoes in Moore Oklahoma; floods in Alberta, Canada; the factory explosion in West, Texas; and the Boston Marathon bombing."

Some other areas that the Knights help with on an annual basis are:

\*Special Olympics \*Habitat for Humanity

\*Global Wheelchair Mission

The following are examples of how the Knights in Kansas are Charitable:

\*Every Seminarian in Kansas has been adopted by one or more Knights of Columbus councils. These councils provide monetary assistance to help the seminarians with school expenses. In 2014, Knights of Columbus councils in Kansas have pledged over \$235,000 for our Seminarians.

\*We have provided over \$92,000 for Religious Education Disbursements, where we provide money to Catholic Schools, CCD programs, RCIA, CYO programs, to help with the expenses they have.



In Kansas total charitable contributions, for 2013 totaled \$2,939,697.


