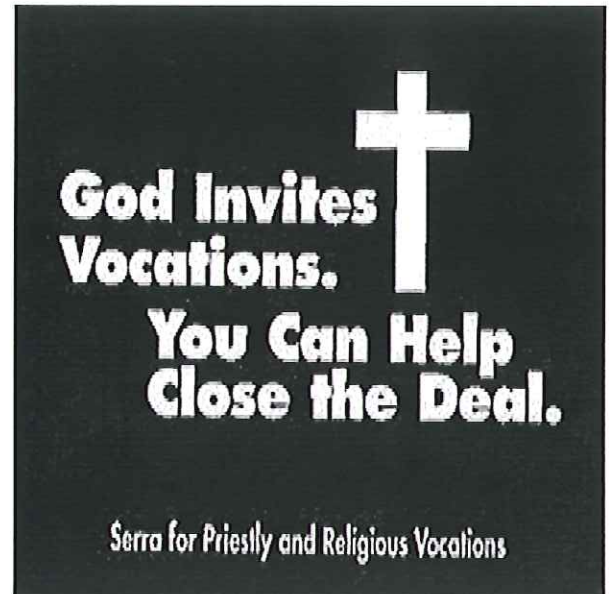

Vocations Grow on Trees... Family Trees

The mother of Pope St. Pius X was present at his installation as pope in 1903. She kissed his large papal ring, as is the custom, then she presented her tiny hand with her wedding ring and said, "Now you kiss my ring—for without it, you never would have received yours!"

Countless priests, bishops, and even popes attribute their vocations to the example of their mothers and fathers. Because everyone's first vocation is to be holy, the most important thing parents can do is to create a home environment where Christian virtue can flourish.

Here are a few specific ideas for helping your children discern their particular vocations:

- Invite a priest, sister, or brother to dinner at your home.
- Show your children a good example of holy marriage.
- Pray for vocations at dinner time during Vocation Awareness Week.
- Read and discuss the Bible stories of Mary's response to God (Luke 1:26-39), and Jesus calling the Apostles (Mt 4:18-22).
- Speak openly about vocations to marriage, priesthood, and religious life.

If your child does express interest in the priesthood or religious life, be supportive. If you're excited, don't push too hard. If you're apprehensive, trust in God's plan. The best thing you can say is, "Whatever God wants for you, I want for you, too. Just keep praying to discover His will for your life."

Scroll through their timeline, and it's filled with spiritual encouragement and photos like the one above—smiling sisters clearly enjoying life. This particular photo received 5,612 likes, 155 shares, and 135 comments—the kind of response that would thrill social media mavens from even the largest corporations.

The Future Pope's Mother

Pope St. Pius X once said, "Every vocation to the priesthood comes from the heart of God, but it passes through the heart of a mother."

In an interview for a Spanish-language newspaper, Pope Francis's only living sibling, María Elena Bergoglio, recounts how their mother discovered he was interested in the priesthood.

At age 19, young Jorge Bergoglio initially felt that he wanted to study medicine. Wanting him to have a quiet place to study, his mother prepared a special room for him by cleaning out a cluttered room on the family's terrace.

One day, the future pope's mom entered the room to clean it. But she ran into a surprise: books of theology.

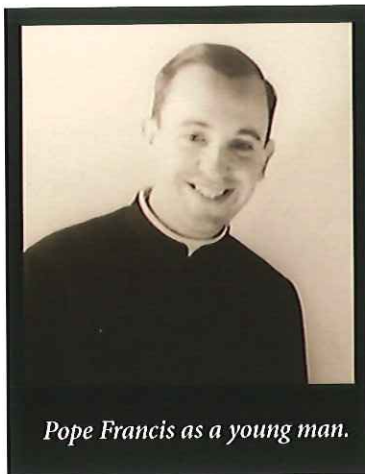
The pope's sister, one of five siblings, recounted the conversation between mother and son:

"Jorge, come here. You told me that you were going to study medicine."

"Yes, mother."

"Why did you lie to me?"

"No, I did not lie to you mother; I am going to study the medicine of the soul."

Surprised by the news, his mother wept, because she understood he would have to leave home to study. His father, however, rejoiced in his son's vocation.

Eventually the entire family embraced his call to the priesthood. Jorge Bergoglio was ordained a priest in 1969 and elected Pope in 2013.

Pope Francis on Celibacy

Before he was pope, Archbishop Bergoglio spoke to an Argentinean journalist about his experience as a young Jesuit seminarian:

"I was dazzled by a girl I met at an uncle's wedding... I was surprised by her beauty, her intellectual brilliance... and, well, I was bowled over for quite a while. I kept thinking and thinking about her. When I returned to the seminary after the wedding, I could not pray for over a week because when I tried to do so, the girl appeared in my head. I had to rethink what I was doing. I was still free because I was a seminarian, so I could have gone back home and that was it. I had to think about my choice again. I chose again—or let myself be chosen by—the religious path. It would be abnormal for this kind of thing not to happen." Abraham Skorka, *Sobre el Cielo y la Tierra*
