# Dismemberment Abortion: **THE HORRIFIC FACTS**

The practice of dismemberment abortion is barbaric and is happening right here in our Kansas communities – and Kansas judges have ruled it is not only legal, **but a legal right.**

Metal forceps clinch body parts of a ***still living***, unborn baby. The baby's limbs are torn from her body, even as her heart continues beating. Science strongly suggests that babies feel pain during the second trimester when these abortions occur – that they feel every excruciating moment. More than 50 babies per month meet this torturous fate in Kansas.



## **THE KANSAS LEGISLATURE BANNED IT.**

Recognizing the heinous nature of the practice, the Kansas Legislature outlawed dismemberment abortion in the spring of 2015.



## **THE KANSAS COURTS REINSTATED IT.**

Kansas district and appeals courts have prevented the dismemberment abortion ban from going into effect, ruling that the Kansas Constitution protects abortion but not unborn human beings.

## **WHAT HAPPENS NEXT.**

The lower court rulings will now be reviewed by the Kansas Supreme Court. The fate of the dismemberment abortion law, and potentially all other existing protections for the unborn, is in the hands of the seven justices of the Kansas Supreme Court.
