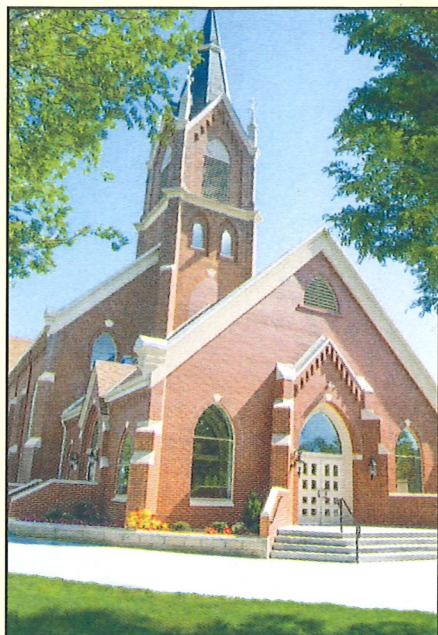

For many people, a speeding ticket usually means a bit of embarrassment, a fine, or the inconvenience of appearing in court. But for those living in poverty, a speeding ticket can become a life-altering event.

In New Orleans, Donald lost his license years ago because he was caught speeding, could not pay the fine, and could not take off work to go to court. Contempt of court citations and unlicensed driving tickets quickly compounded the initial fine. Donald was losing hope that he could clear the backlog, get a better-paying job, and support his growing family while living right above the poverty level.

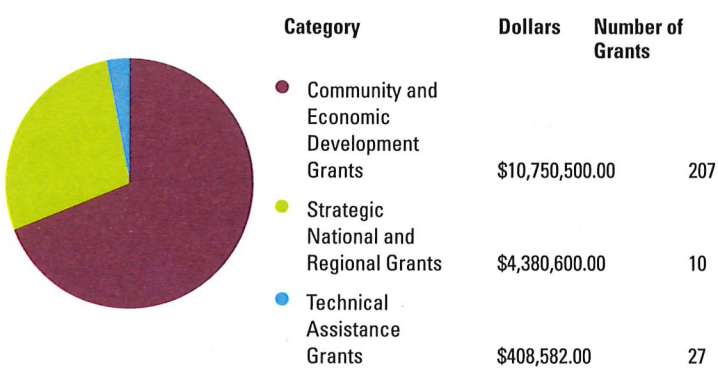
Thanks to your generosity to CCHD, the New Orleans Workers Center for Racial Justice (NOWCRJ) was able to provide Donald with the support he needed to change his situation. NOWCRJ hosted a clinic where Donald set up payment plans for his fines and got his license reinstated. Now Donald has a new job and has

been able to save money to move into his own apartment. NOWCRJ is also working with the judicial system to reduce backlogs, expunge records, and change how penalties are issued. With your contributions, our brothers and sisters across the country are breaking out of the cycle of poverty.

Para muchas personas, cuando son detenidas por exceso de velocidad, significa pasar un momento vergonzoso, pagar una multa o la inconveniencia de tener que ir a la corte. Pero para aquellos que viven en pobreza, una multa por exceso de velocidad, podría alterarles la vida.

En New Orleans, hace años que a Donald le quitaron su licencia de conducir ya que lo detuvieron por exceso de velocidad, él no pudo pagar la multa y no pudo salir del trabajo para ir a la corte. El desacato a las citas de la corte y conducir sin licencia agravaron rápidamente la multa inicial. Donald estaba perdiendo la esperanza de poder salir de todo este atraso, encontrar un trabajo mejor remunerado y mantener a su creciente familia a la par de vivir justo arriba del nivel de pobreza.

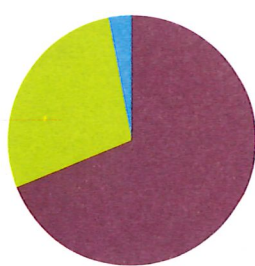
Gracias a su generosidad con CCHD, al Centro de trabajadores para la justicia social de Nueva Orleans (NOWCRJ) le fue posible proporcionarle a Donald el apoyo necesario para cambiar su situación. NOWCRJ organizó una clínica en donde Donald pudo establecer unos planes de pago para esas multas y logró que le

restablecieran su licencia de conducir. Ahora, Donald tiene un nuevo trabajo y ha podido ahorrar para mudarse a su propio departamento. NOWCRJ también está trabajando con el sistema judicial para reducir atrasos, borrar expedientes y cambiar la forma en que se emiten las sanciones. Con sus contribuciones, nuestros hermanos y hermanas en todo el país están saliendo del ciclo de pobreza.

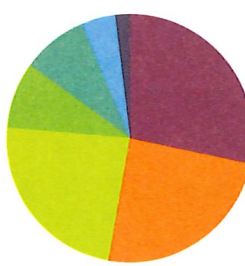
